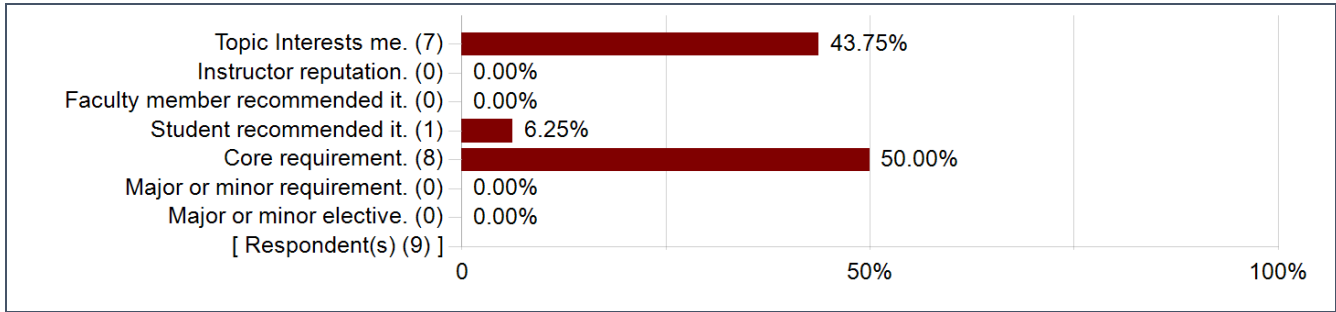

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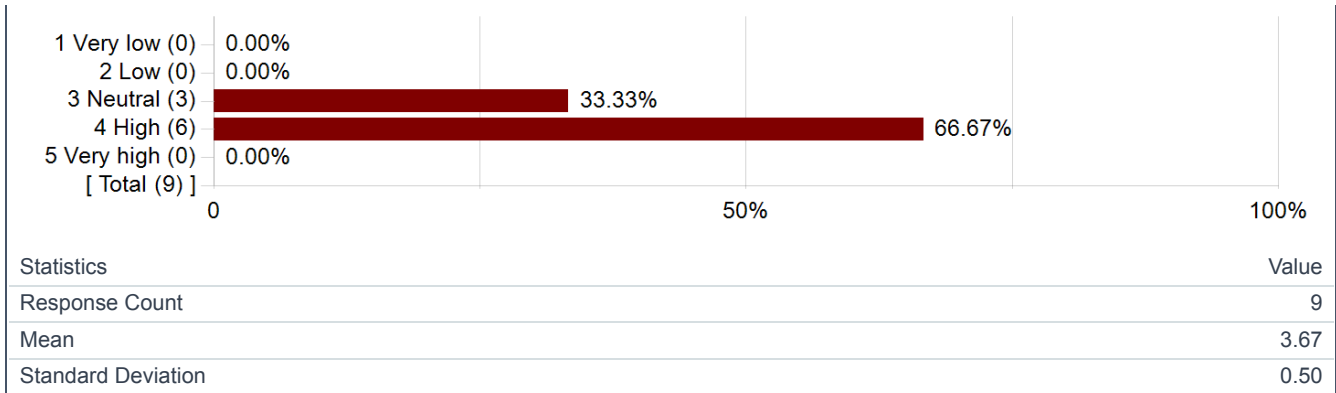

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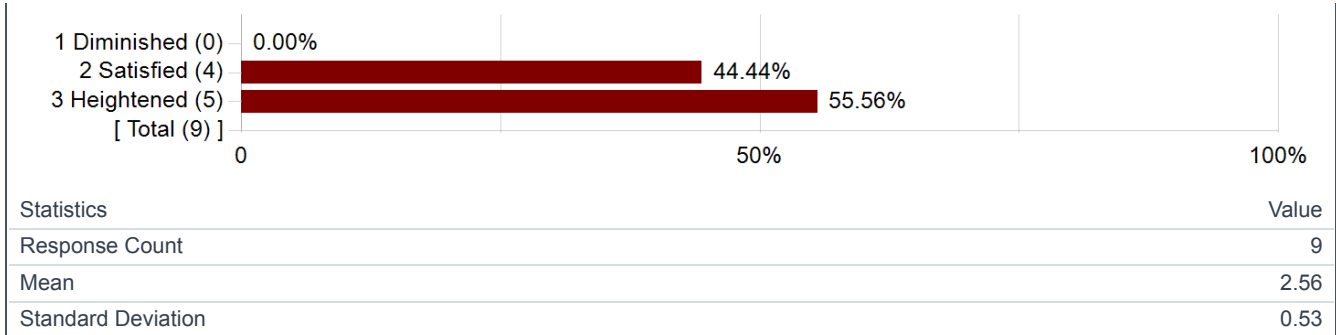

Comments
Large group discussions and lectures helped me understand material and themes more broadly, while small group discussions contributed to closer analysis of specific ideas.
Professor Whalen was excellent at leading discussions, especially explaining ambiguous or complex concepts in our readings and also comparing the stances of different authors. The discussions significantly contributed to essay writing, because the major topics we discussed were often given out as paper prompts. The small group discussions were also great because Professor Whalen always had discussion questions prepared for us to think about in groups.
Class was always helpful in understanding the text and thinking of interesting ideas.

The discussions were very helpful, especially the Thursday (small group) discussions. They were a good way to discuss the basic concepts of the reading with peers, especially for the more complicated text. I liked the essay prompts and I think they helped me engage with the content of the texts well analytically.
Discussions were organized and helped to work out the ideas within the texts. The small group assignments did a similar job, except in a closer-knit setting.
I enjoyed the smaller break out groups. This gave me the opportunity to share my thoughts when it was more difficult in the bigger zoom class.

Professor Whalen is good at explaining difficult concepts and helping us develop and think through thoughts and criticisms we may have about the texts.
Organized lectures, including different formats of learning such as big discussions and small group discussions, canvas discussion posts. More specifically, I liked how she focused on a few major topics for each reading for us to talk about, as this greatly enhanced my understanding of the texts.
She lead a good class and navigated online learning well by dividing time between smaller breakout groups and larger discussion. She also balanced discussion well between her own inputs and students speaking.

I think she led discussions well, especially given the difficulties of having all our class over Zoom. I found office hours to be very helpful, especially when it came to talking about theses for the papers.

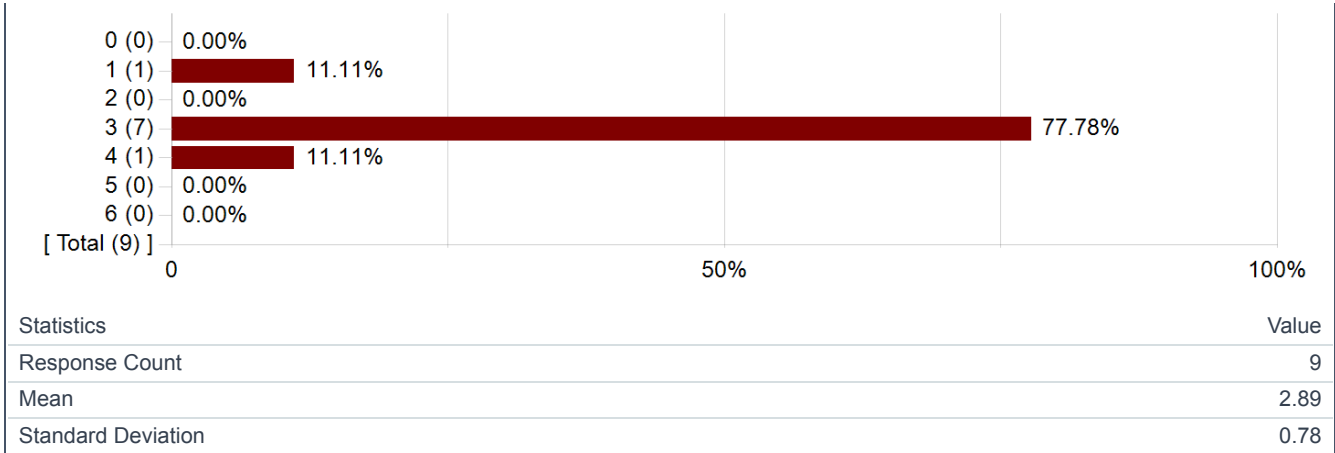
### Did the instructor make adjustments to the course mid-quarter? If so, please comment on the effectiveness of those adjustments.

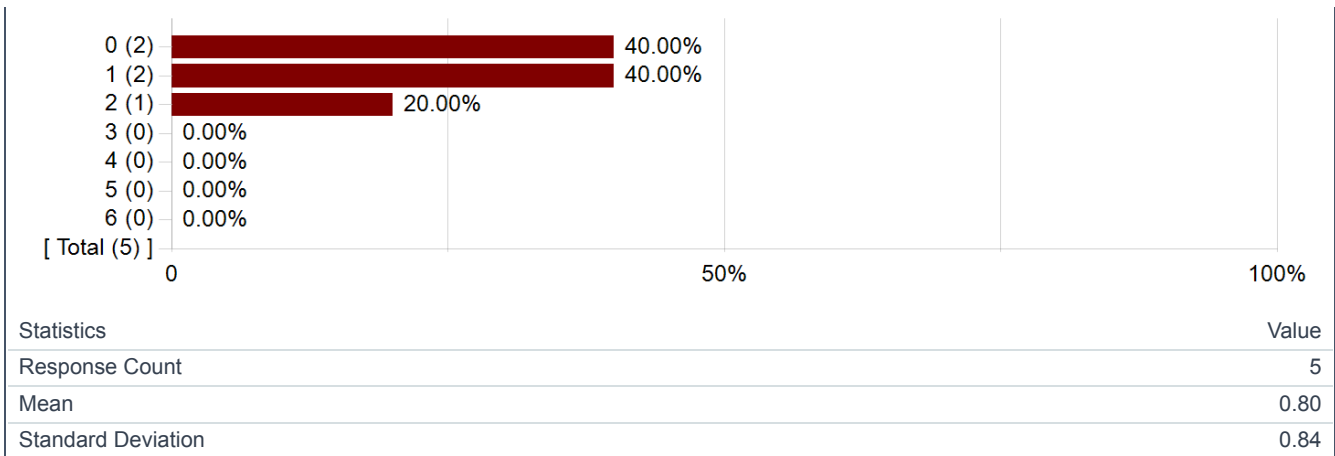

Teacher was just really kind and open to all sorts of thoughts in class.

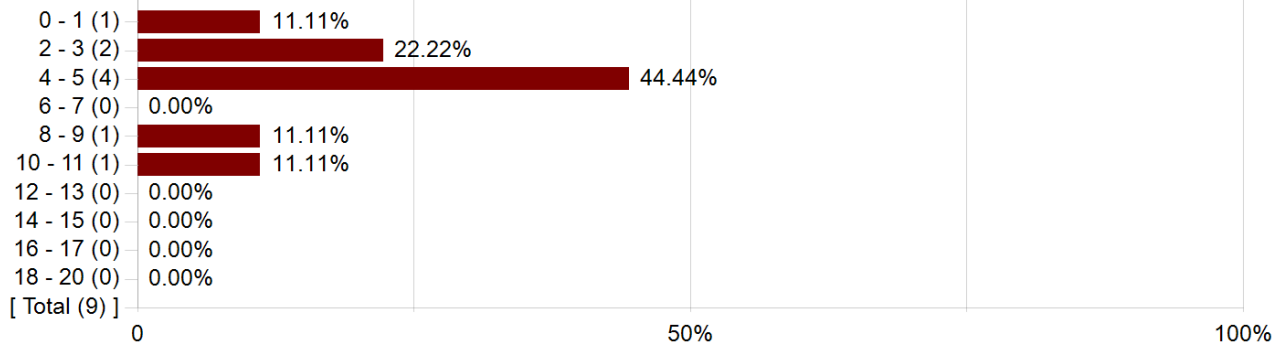
How many hours per week did you spend in lectures for this course (synchronous or asynchronous)?



How many hours per week did you spend in other scheduled activities for this course (labs, discussions, etc.)?

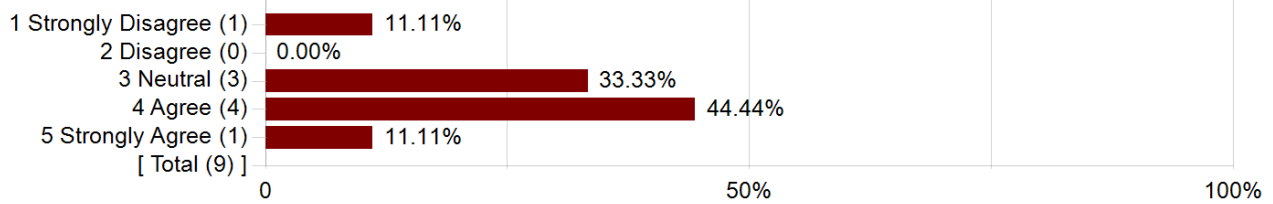


How many additional hours per week did you spend on this course (reading, problem sets, writing, etc.)?



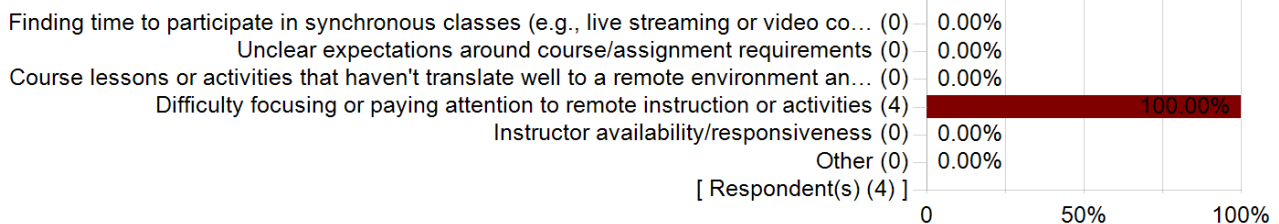
